

Post Communion Prayer


In the sharing of this sacred meal, let us pray for God's good news to be lived out.

May the words, the actions, and the symbols we have shared in this time, serve to remind us of our interconnected relationships.


May we live into this covenant with a spirit of unity and grace. Amen.
