Call to action: Grave concern with Saskatchewan Income Support (SIS) Program - new

[Regina Anti-Poverty Ministry](#) is asking Living Skies Regional Council to write to our MLAs and the minister of social services. The concern: much evidence of growing poverty and sharply rising homelessness as we move into winter, due to deeply troubling changes in key social assistance programs in SK. Take action in support of Palestinian Mission and Service partner designated “terrorist” - new

Six leading, respected Palestinian civil society and human rights organizations have been extraordinarily and suddenly designated as “terrorist organizations” by the Israeli government. [Defence for Children International-Palestine](#), a Mission and Service partner, is one of the six organizations. This means all their activities are now banned, and it authorizes the Israeli government to close their offices, seize their assets, and arrest and jail their staff members. It also prohibits funding or even publicly expressing support for their activities. Imagine this happening to your congregation, your Regional Council office, or the General Council offices. Here in Living Skies, we have a number of knowledgeable people who are committed to some form of Guaranteed Livable Income (GLI) or Universal Basic Income (UBI). They've been out and about, educating in their congregation and beyond.
