60th Anniversary of UCW

How Sask. United Church of Canada Women Came into Being

I will attempt to explain how the Sask. United Church of Canada Women evolved.

On October 2, 2012, a motion was passed at a meeting at the Saskatchewan Conference office "that the members of Saskatchewan Conference UCW Coordinating Committee disband as of October 2, 2012". The result was that the Saskatchewan Conference Network for Women of the United Church became "Women of the United Church Network" with two coordinators. One to be a representative of the UCW and the other to be from outside the UCW. From that meeting there was a representative from the UCW appointed.

In 2015 I was asked by Sask. Conference Nominating Committee to be one of the coordinators of Sask. Conference Women's Network. At that time Betty Anne Williamson from Indian Head was the UCW representative. I agreed, but made it very clear that I was also UCW.

In 2015 I attended the General Council of The United Church of Canada at Corner Brook, Newfoundland. There I met members of the National UCW and was invited to the National UCW Annual Meeting in Mississauga, Ontario.

Imagine their surprise and mine when they thought there were no UCWs left in Saskatchewan! It was important to maintain communication with UCWs and other Women's Groups in Sask. Conference. That is when the Newsletter started and has been regularly posted on the Conference/Regional Council website as well as e-mailed and mailed to those who requested it.

For health reasons, Betty Anne was forced to resign in 2016 and Susan Dokken agreed to come on as my co-convener.

2017 was the 55th Anniversary of UCW so Susan and/or I attended celebration events at Grace-Westminster in Saskatoon, Calvary United in Prince Albert, the Kipling Fall Rally at Kipling United Church and St. Andrew's United Church in Moose Jaw. On July 10th to 14th, twelve women from Saskatchewan attended the 55th Anniversary Celebration of National United Church Women at the University of B.C. Campus in Vancouver, B.C.

We also hosted the Women's Camp at Tapawingo and attended the Women's Camp at Christopher Lake.

In April 2018 we hosted a Women's Gathering at St. Andrew's College for all women in the United Church, thanks to funding from Sask. Conference. After round table discussions, a motion was carried to form the Saskatchewan United Church of Canada Women to include all women in the province and also be a close affiliate of the National UCW. The suggestion was made that co-chairs would remain in office for two years (staggered), then be followed by the 1st vice-chair and second vice-chair, etc. Secretary and Treasurer were left to be voted on each year or until one resigned. I volunteered to keep doing the newsletter. It was also suggested that we try to hold a one-day Regional Event one year and a larger three-day Women's Gathering the following year.

Women's Camps were popular with all ages. In 2019 Sask. UCCW hosted Women's Camps at Tapawingo and Wellman Lake. We also took part in the Annual Women's Camp at Christopher Lake. Women's Camps can now be totally handled by the individual camp boards with them collecting the registrations, planning and taking any profit. We will provide publicity throughout the Regional Council. Women from other Regional Councils might even be interested in attending.

Here are some of my personal reasons for encouraging the formation of Sask. UCCW:

- 1. Two people could not continue to plan and host events throughout the province.
- 2. We needed to have a bank account to deposit registrations and pay for events as they happened. Volunteer hosts could not be expected to pay costs out of their own pockets and then be reimbursed.
- 3. Having an elected executive helps to spread the work load and bring forth new ideas.
- 4. We need the structure, stability and knowledge of UCW in order to carry on.

The Sask UCC Women has a mandate to reach out to the women of the United Church within Living Skies Regional Council through the existing United Church Women (UCW) structure, as well as through non-UCW groups and the individual women of the church. A newsletter, events, and connections with the wider movement of women in The United Church of Canada are among our many efforts to keep women connected and supported.

I partly wrote and edited a book "Celebrating 55 Years of UCW in Saskatchewan" and after the cost of printing was covered the proceeds went into the Sask. UCCW account. In this book there are details of the first Inaugural meetings of UCW, stories, mini sermons as well as the decision to disband at the provincial level. If anyone is interested, I have a few books left for \$12.

Without the financial support of Sask. Conference/Living Skies Regional Council we could not do anything. Hopefully, as time goes on, we will receive more individual monetary support for events and communications.
