

National President-Elect Requirements

- 1 Have held, or holding, the position of United Church Women Region/District or former Conference/District President.
- 2 Candidates must be nominated by her Region/District or two members of the current National United Church Women Executive.
- 3 Nominations for National President-Elect, with a short bio, must be received by the [National United Church Women's secretary](#) no later than June 15th of the election year for National President-Elect. If nomination papers are delivered by Canada Post, or any other delivery service, it must be postmarked no later than June 15th.
- 4 At the close of nominations, the National United Church Women's secretary will circulate the names of the nominated candidates to the Region/Districts and the National United Church Women Executive along with the short bio provided by the candidates no later than June 30th.
- 5 Nominated candidates will be given the opportunity to provide a campaign video, written material, attend the annual meeting of the National United Church Women Executive via Zoom or other media streams available on the scheduled day for the election.
- 6 If no nominations are received by June 15th, then the National United Church Women will open nominations at their annual meeting where nominations will be entertained providing candidates are nominated by two voting members of the National United Church Women. *Nominated candidates must meet the first requirement.*
- 7 The position of the National President-Elect is the start of a four-year term commitment:
One year as National President- Elect, two years as President, one year as Past President

Have you registered? Registration is now open on a first-come-first-served basis. We have approximately 260 ladies registered so far.
Have you applied for a bursary to assist with travel expenses? For those who haven't applied for a bursary grant, there is one more date remaining to qualify for the Agatha Kaasa Bursary Fund grant.
Deadline is April 15, 2022. A reminder, that if you have received your \$400 bursary, you must still register for the event.



Agatha Kaasa Bursary Fund

To apply for one of the \$400 grants to attend the Anniversary, allow plenty of lead time to send in your application for approval. Applications cannot be accepted after the closing date of April 15, 2022. Complete the Personal Details section; skip the financial section; Letters of Reference are not required. Include name of your UCW group with Region/District information. Date and sign the application! Please note that if for any reason you cannot attend the Anniversary in July 2022, you are required to return the grant money.



Have you booked your flight? We will have people ready to meet you at the Sydney NS airport. If you have already registered and want to add information to your on-line registration, simply go into the registration site, click on your region, find your name and click on the box entitled “Actions” with the little pen cursor. You can then change or add information. We would like to know when you are arriving and when you are leaving so we can organize our shuttles and greeters. As there is only one line for this on the on-line form, include both your arrival and departure information in this field. Sydney has only a few flights a day; please be aware so you are able to book a flight.

Tours must be booked in advance! If you have opted not to participate in the tours on Wednesday, we would like everyone to know you will not be able to get on the bus or book a tour at the last minute. We have to give our final numbers to our Tour company well in advance of the event. If you opt not to go on the tour your day is your own.

Have you booked your hotel? When last we checked all bookings have been made at the Hampton Inn with the exception of six people booked at the Cambridge Suites. There are still rooms available at the Hampton which is connected to the venue. We encourage women to book at the Hampton first and Cambridge Suites second to reduce the number of shuttles needed each day. All hotels we have contracts with have *Breakfast Included* with the room. Please make sure you eat before you come to the venue.

Monday, July 11th Registration begins at 2pm
Our event officially kicks off with a buffet dinner (supper time) at 5pm and evening Opening Ceremony

Tuesday, July 12th is a full day and evening.

Wednesday, July 13th is Tour Day. We will all gather that evening with the *Men of the Deeps*.

Thursday, July 14th is another full day and evening which includes our featured Banquet.

Friday, July 15th In the morning we gather for a communion service and the Closing Ceremony, with event wrapping up at the lunch. Hope this helps with your scheduling of travel and visiting Cape Breton family and friends. *The schedule will soon be posted to the webpage at ucceast.ca. (Choose Region 15, then Ministries, then UCW, scroll to 60th news links).*



Development of *Then Let Us Sing!* Moves into the Next Phase

The development of *Then Let Us Sing!*, the United Church's new digital music resource, enters a new phase this month now that the deadline for submissions of new music has passed.

Composers and text writers from across Canada have seized the opportunity to have their works included. By the deadline of January 15th they submitted several hundred hymns, tunes, and texts. So now, the Materials Curation Sub-Committee is getting ready to review them and decide which will be included in the resource.

Materials Curation has accepted submissions for *Then Let Us Sing!* that use fresh language for God as well as accessible musical styles, and that lift up and prioritize racialized, Indigenous, francophone, LGBTQQITTPA+ and Two Spirit people, people with disabilities, and people of diverse linguistic communities. All submissions related to congregational singing and worship were encouraged with a focus on specific community interests and challenges.

The new hymns will be in addition to most of the hymns that we've come to love in *Voices United*, *More Voices*, and our French hymnal *Nos Voix Unis*, which will be included on the portal. A hard copy booklet of the new hymns is also planned, for communities of faith that wish to supplement the hymnbooks already in our pews. *Then Let Us Sing!* will be The United Church of Canada's most current—and future-focused—content source for congregational singing, worship, and liturgy planning. Release date is scheduled for the fall of 2024, in time for our celebration of the Church's 100th birthday. Technology Tip for clipping images and text: ✂

Here's a quick shortcut when saving images and text for use in your writing.

Microsoft /PC Users Snip Tool: Windows Key + Shift + S

Mac Users Screenshot or Snip Tool: Command Key + Shift + 4

Both tools require that you hold all three keys down at the same time to activate the cross-hair tool (+). Drag the tool across the section of the screen you want to capture. Click to save/Hit the return key and data is copied to the clipboard as an image, for easy pasting into your documents or ready to save to a folder for later use. Avoid copyright infringement; give credit and document your sources.
