We are still working with Third Avenue United in Saskatoon and have yet to set up a commission because we are having trouble finding people. The board and trustees are meeting soon to move further along in the foreclosure business.

### **Chairperson Update**

Tricia Gerhard has been working with the Faith Leaders Task Group which has led to interesting conversations about the role of worship in our functioning as a church.

### Freedom2c.com

A website has been created calling for churches and other social organizations to disregard the current COVID-19 restrictions and begin gathering again beginning on February 28, 2021.

We do not endorse this call, nor do we encourage any churches to join.

Tricia Gerhard will draft a letter to say the regional council executive encourages congregations to continue to comply with restrictions regardless of outside pressures to ignore them, and that our call as faith communities is to care for our constituents and wider communities.

# Nuclear Energy Petition

We received a letter of concern from Vicki Obedkoff, ICUCEC Board Member about signing on to a nuclear energy petition. The petition would call for the correction of the course of review process by the Government of Canada, which currently, is a very short timeline. A longer timeline will be more inclusive and give more people a chance to speak on it.

The deadline is January 31, 2021 which is only three days away. Tricia Gerhard will write a letter to Vicki Obedkoff letting her know we don't have enough time to review and have discussion on this matter.

# Committee on Community of Faith Support

A lot of churches are struggling right now. There are more churches with pastoral charge supervisors than with called or appointed ministers. There is also a high amount vacancies.

Congregations have asked how we are imagining or re-imagining regional understandings of ministry. Therefore, we can begin to think about how we can re-imagine what ministry might look like in parts of the province.

We are also having conversations about Indigenous Ministry in the regional council. We are down to one person who is actively involved in Indigenous Ministry in the province.

**Band Blast** 

The regional Advent Concert in December 2020 was a success, and the executive supports planning and holding another online spring/Easter concert.

Social Media Paid Advertising & Media Releases Kent Mohn spent a small amount of money on a Facebook ad campaign targeting the general public to join regional online worship services. There was a notable increase in website traffic during campaign.

Kent brought up the idea of issuing media releases as a way to increase visibility and indicate the regional council's position on various issues.

We would like to have a longer discussion about paid social media advertising and media releases. Richard Manley-Tannis ran social media ads for the former Winnipeg Presbytery and the former Conference of Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario. Kent Mohn will be in touch with Richard to start a conversation about this topic.

## **FINANCE**

# **Property Commission Report**

to Living Skies Regional Council Executive September 8 to December 31, 2020

The property commission held three meetings in the last quarter of the year (October 16, November 13 & December 11) and made seven property decisions via email. All of our meetings were held using Zoom video conferencing.

In September, we received approval from the Living Skies Regional Council (LSRC) Executive to post property commission minutes on the LSRC website. As a result, our reports to the executive will be in a summary format and will no longer contain all the details of each decision. We will be reporting the work of the commission using four major categories:

- 1. Congregational Properties properties that are the responsibility of existing congregations
- 2. Abandoned Properties properties (not including cemeteries) that are the responsibility of the regional council by virtue of Manual section G.1.5.7.
- 3. Abandoned Cemeteries cemeteries that are the responsibility of the regional council by virtue of Manual section G.1.5.7.
- 4. Policies recommended changes to LSRC property policies

# **Congregational Properties:**

We are currently working with twenty-seven communities of faith. As of December 31, 2020 we have five communities of faith that are planning to renovate, rent or purchase property, eleven in the process of selling property, and sixteen that are in the process of disbanding. In the past three months the following decisions were made:

Approval of Rental Agreement:

Wesley United Church in Regina

Approval of Tender or Listing of Church Buildings & Lots:

At our October meeting we rejected the request from Third Avenue United Church to spend approximately \$80,000 to repair the roof of the church building. This is a property that is no longer owned by The United Church of Canada. At the same meeting, the property commission requested that the Living Skies Regional Council Executive take responsibility for the Third Avenue United Church congregation, Saskatoon in order to formally disband the congregation and disburse their assets.

# **Abandoned Properties**

The property commission is continuing our work to sell or transfer abandoned properties within the regional council. Some are being transferred to the rural municipality and others sold to neighbouring landowners. In the past three months the following decisions have been made:

### **Cemeteries**

We are working with a list of close to fifty abandoned cemeteries within the boundaries of this regional council. Where possible, we are attempting to transfer responsibility to the rural municipality. If the rural municipality is unwilling to take responsibility and no one is currently caring for the property, then we will endeavour to find someone to cut the lawn for a fee. There are many cemeteries that are currently being cared for by local

individuals or organizations and we are working to set up protocols for oversight of these properties.

In the past three months the following decisions have been made:

Request that United Church of Canada Transfer Cemetery

 October 26, 2020 – New Ottawa Cemetery (lot previously belonging to the Methodist Church) to RM of Douglas

Approval for Transfer of Cemetery

 October 26, 2020 – New Ottawa Cemetery (2<sup>nd</sup> lot belonging to Speers UC) to RM of Douglas

### **Policies**

No new policies were created during the reporting period. In September, the Executive approved our new policy regarding the dispersal of funds from the sale of abandoned properties and the policy and processes document has been updated to reflect this change.

Thanks to the original members of the property commission (Bev Kostichuk, Daryl Woods, George Thurlow and Shannon McCarthy) for your continuing dedication to this work and a warm welcome to Gayle Wensley who officially joined us at our October meeting.

# **Living Skies Regional Council Property Fund Policy** Background for Living Skies Regional Council Executive

Principles and philosophy

We currently have 48 **cemeteries** located on 62 parcels of land. These have devolved to the Regional Council by virtue of Manual section G.1.5.7. While most of this property was acquired when each denomination had its own cemetery, most of there cemeteries have been used by the community. Some are active and some have not had a burial in many years. Many are well cared for by local volunteers but some not. We have tried to transfer these cemeteries to local groups but most are not incorporated. R.M.s are unwilling to assume responsibility for cemeteries, so we must fulfill our pastoral care responsibilities to both the deceased members of our communities and their surviving relatives by maintaining cemeteries.

Currently the Living Skies Regional Council also has some 38 properties in 48 parcels. These have devolved to the Regional Council by virtue of Manual section G.1.5.7. Most are either vacant lots in villages or hamlets or the corner of a farmer's field. We intend to dispose of these by sale to the adjoining landowner or by tender as appropriate. Good stewardship says we should try for the best price but also dispose of these properties in a timely fashion. These properties will not result in costs to the Fund unless they have buildings.

We have 10 buildings associated with the above cemeteries and 7 buildings on other property. They are in various states of repair. All represent liability if someone even a trespasser gets hurt. If any of them were to catch fire the United Church would be liable for fire fighting costs. We are trying to sell the other property with the buildings. So far vacant lots have brought more than those with buildings since purchasers factor in demolition or repair.

- 1. Those buildings associated with cemeteries need to be Sold to be moved off
- 2. repaired so as to reduce risk of liability or
- 3. Demolished.

The latter options will cost money since there seems little patience for piecemeal demolition to salvage material and heavy equipment costs money even to transport it to some rural location

There are over 200 active communities of faith almost all of whom have buildings which cost on average 25% of their budgets to heat, clean, insure and keep in good repair [source my time doing Finance in Prairie Pine Presbytery] As rural and town churches which relied on volunteers for repairs have closed and volunteers have got older, repairs have become more expensive when one needs stone masons, roofers, HVAC people etc. With mission support money drying up communities of faith are looking for assistance. This is to clarify that this fund is not a source since \$10,000 would not go far.

# **Living Skies Regional Council Property Fund Policy**

This policy covers the funds generated by the sale of property under the control of Living Skies Regional Council by virtue of communities of faith disbanding pursuant to Manual section G.1.5.7. It also provides for funds to maintain such properties or repair or demolish any buildings which are part of those G.1.5.7. properties

It should have a minimum balance of \$8,000.00 and maximum of \$15,000.00

## **Sources of fund:**

- 1. proceeds from the sale of The Regional Council's real property pursuant to Manual section G.1.5.7
- 2. Funds which presbyteries had set aside to deal with derelict or abandoned properties
- 3. Funds transferred from the Regional Council's general funds to carry out the purposes herein
- 4. Proceeds from the lease of any mineral rights acquired pursuant to Manual section G.1.5.7

### **Uses of Funds:**

- 1. Maintenance of Cemeteries not associated with any Communities of Faith which are the Regional Council's responsibility pursuant to Manual section G.1.5.7
- 2. Repair or demolition of derelict or abandoned buildings associated with Cemeteries not associated with any Communities of Faith which are the Regional Council's responsibility with the goal of making these buildings suitable to sell or other wise transfer
- 3. Repair or demolition of derelict or abandoned buildings not associated with any active communities of faith which are the Regional Council's responsibility pursuant to Manual section G.1.5.7

### This fund is not for:

1. Purchase repair or maintenance of buildings or other real property of active communities of faith
