Rev. Bill Corkum passed away at the age of 71, on Sunday March 13th, 2022, in Winnipeg MB.

He was predeceased by his Father Burton & Mother Edna. He passed away peacefully after only 6 weeks in Oakview Place. He leaves behind his Wife Marilyn, Son Nathan, and Son Peter (Jill), much loved grandchildren Lachlan, Lucy, Preston & Eliza, and sisters Candace (Rick) and Debbie (Steve) and nephews Simon and Breton, and his Anderson family.

Bill was born on February 3, 1951. He grew up in Souris PEI, Ottawa, Kemptville Ont, and Lunenburg NS. He attended Mt Allison University and AST completing his Theology degree. He was placed in Saskatchewan and served as the Minister in the United Church at North Portal. He continued his ministry alongside his wife at Maple Creek, Melfort, & Weyburn. In 2000 they moved to Winnipeg where he served for 11 years before retiring. He continued to volunteer in the Church and community, and was a member of The Winnipeg Male Chorus, and as a volunteer ambassador at the airport.
