The Property Commission has offered a correction to the Self-Assessment checklist to more accurately reflect the policy and practice within our Regional Council regarding trustees. The correction offered is on p. 3 – “remove question 31”. According to the Property Commission, the work and expense of updating the Land Title every time there is a change in trustees is not worth it and is only required when selling or mortgaging property. NEW - An invitation to 'Caging Childhood' - Online via Zoom, Wednesday, March 30, 6:30 to 7:45pm.PT

Can you imagine a 13 to 17-year-old child arrested on the suspicion of throwing a stone? Then detained in an interrogation centre unknown to their family? Interrogated without a parent or lawyer present?

Each year approximately 500-700 Palestinian children, some as young as 12 years old, are detained and prosecuted in the Israeli military court system. The most common charge is stone-throwing. To learn more about the reality on the ground for Palestinian children and their families, please join us for a short film screening of *Caging Childhood: Palestinian Children in Israel's Military Detention System*.

The documentary shares the stories of three Palestinian children in the occupied West Bank and their experiences being detained, interrogated, prosecuted, and imprisoned in the Israeli military detention system.

It was produced by Defence for Children International – Palestine (DCI:P). DCI-P is one of our overseas partners supported by the Mission and Service. The screening will be followed by a discussion and letter writing event. Shaina Low, the Advocacy Officer from DCI:P will join us to respond to questions and provide an update.
