She was wondering if you might like to order. MASKS are 3 ply, 100% cotton and are reversible, crest only on one side with narrow adjustable elastic. UCW mask is more secure than any masks on the market. They also prevent glasses from fogging and you can sing with them in place. All proceeds are still going to our 60th Anniversary project Women for Change Zambia. They are \$15.00 plus \$2.50 shipping.
