

Pastoral Relations Ponderings – Volume 36


Greetings from the Pastoral Relations desk! I hope the warmth of the sun combined with all the rain is bringing spring to you! 1. **An update from the Committee on Community of Faith Support** – the Self-Assessment material has been distributed to ministry personnel and pastoral charge supervisors – it is found [here](#) in the Committee on Community of Faith Support file.
