Temporary Mileage Rate change

General Council Executive approved the following proposal at its recent meeting: "Considering the recent spike in gasoline prices and the prediction that they may remain at these levels for some time, it is proposed that the Executive of the General Council temporarily, to September 30, 2022, increase the current minimum reimbursement rate to 75% of the CRA 2022 "reasonable allowance rate for the first 5,000 kilometers driven", or \$0.46 per kilometer, and authorize the General Secretary to extend this temporary increase to December 31, 2022 if fuel prices remain high."

NEW - Honouring Elder Alberta Billy

Alberta Billy, the We Wai Kai Elder who in 1985 demanded that The United Church of Canada apologize for its role in colonization and the loss of Indigenous languages, culture, and spirituality, passed away on June 13, 2022. NEW - Guaranteed Livable Income petition: July 2 deadline

The United Church hosts a national Guaranteed Livable Income (GLI) network, which includes reps from our Regional Council. Many people ask what GLI could look like in practice; it stands in such contrast to current social assistance programs that it can be hard to imagine. Prince Edward Island has signalled its willingness to enter into a partnership with the federal government to begin such a program. NEW - Solidarity letters requested for LGBTQIA -affirming Korean Methodist minister

In 2020, Rev. Lee Dong-hwan of the Korean Methodist Church accepted an invitation to bless the crowd at the Incheon Pride Festival. As a result, on October 15, 2020, the church stripped him of his ability to practice as a minister for two years. His appeal of that decision is finally being heard beginning on June 13, 2022. St. Andrew's College seeks to strengthen governance structure

The Nominations and Board Education Committee of St. Andrew's College is pleased to report several significant developments as the College transitions to a new season of faithful theological education in collaboration with Lutheran Theological Seminary and the College of Emmanuel & St. Chad.

The College announced the launch of the new Lifelong Learning Pathway and the academic integration with our Saskatchewan Theological Union (STU) partners.

We are pleased also to announce three new faculty positions for the STU. Dr. Lynn Caldwell will assume the tenured position as the new Professor of Theological Ethics; Dr. Becca Whitla will assume the tenure track position as the new Professor of Practical Ministry, and Dr. Bernon Lee will be Professor of Hebrew Scriptures and the first Educational Coordinator of the College's Lifelong Learning Pathway.

The Board of Regents has renewed the contract of Dea. Dr. Richard Manley-Tannis as Principal to 2028.

As the College enters this historic transition, it will continue to rely on a strong governance structure made up of competent, skilled and dedicated Board and committee members.

We are seeking potential nominees to fill several positions on the Board and committees.

Our areas of urgent need at the moment are the Finance Committee and Audit Committee. Your Story Matters: Toward Thriving and Equitable Pastoral Relationships

United Church protests the killing of a Palestinian journalist

[Please click here to read a letter sent by the national church to the federal government](#) after Israeli forces shot Palestinian American journalist Shireen Abu Akleh. Rev. Dr. Ndhlovu of Church in Mission asks Canada to call for an investigation into this violation of international law.

Ms. Abu Akleh and her colleagues were wearing flak jackets, clearly marked with 'Press'. Israeli forces later entered the hospital where her body lay, firing tear gas. They also invaded Abu Akleh's home, where her family was mourning, and removed a Palestinian flag. Her funeral procession was then attacked by a large group of Israeli forces in riot gear who beat the pallbearers and mourners.
