As part of our church's living into the Apologies, let's join with others to help ensure the ongoing history and impacts of the residential schools system are never forgotten - and that together, we bring about real change. Please make plans for Sunday worship on September 24; Sunday October 1 is also an important space for naming the ongoing violence facing Indigenous women, girls, and Two Spirit people in preparation for October 4, National Day of Action for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG).
