NEW: First anniversary of the killings on James Smith Cree Nation

On September 4 2022, many across Saskatchewan woke to emergency alerts on our cell phones. Throughout a frightening and confused day, it emerged that 11 people were murdered and 18 injured on James Smith Cree Nation and the neighbouring village of Weldon. The fear, grief, and trauma that marked this terrible day continue to deeply affect the communities, especially JSCN. Below are some stories from survivors, some told publicly for the first time. Please be aware that they are emotionally difficult to read. But they also let us hear and see the survivors, learn from them, and pray with them. May the stories be a guide for our continued prayers, our learning journeys, and whatever accompaniment we can offer.

An invitation to active Ministry Personnel from The Right Reverend Dr. Carmen Landsdowne....

"If you've been following me on social media or read E-ssentials digital newsletter, you'll know that part of my Flourishing project was a pilot leadership school: (Re)Generate: Invigorating Leadership. I'm happy to say that the nomination/application form is now available on the UCC website."

The program is for ministry personnel, is **3 weeks per year in 2024 & 2025**, with prescribed weeks (avoiding church busy seasons and regional meeting season, based on what we knew when we chose the weeks).

Cost: Up to \$1,500/year, for a total of \$3,000 over two years. This is based on the full-time continuing education allowance for ministry personnel. Recognizing that some ministry personnel are not in full-time employment with a community of faith, and some ministry personnel do not have access to \$1,500 per year, cost will not be a barrier to participation.

To enhance the diversity of participants (including part-time ministers), and to fulfill our commitments to equity, some participants could contribute less, or apply for funds towards child care, or other expenses that would help facilitate their participation.
