- 1. An update from the Committee on Community of Faith Support this fall we will be reviewing the guidelines for annual reports and the self-assessment checklists to help communities of faith assess their health and vitality for faith-filled ministry. We are looking for up to 3 more people to join this committee.
- 2. An update from the Committee on Lay Leadership Support the input from current Licensed Lay Worship Leaders has been woven into the policy governing this work. We are grateful for open, helpful feedback from this gifted group of people. Once approved by the Regional Council Executive, it will be available broadly for implementation. An update from the Committee on Ministry Personnel Support retreats for active ministry personnel are being planned in Regina and Saskatoon in early November as a way to ground folks ahead of the Advent season. Work continues in finding ways to support our retired ministry personnel. We are looking for 1 more person to join this committee.

If you are the treasurer of your community of faith, please note the increase for visiting ministry personnel (pulpit supply) and communicate with ADP regarding the increase for minimum salary for ministry personnel. Both increases are effective January 1, 2024. Contact me if you have questions.
