Join Centre for Christian Studies on Friday, October 27, 2023 at noon (Central Time) for an online discussion of climate change and how to respond as faith-filled individuals and as ministers. This past summer has delivered unprecedented and extreme weather phenomena to many parts of Canada and around the world. What are the implications of climate change to your community and context? Who are we within the community of creation, and what is our responsibility to all life on Earth? What does climate change mean for the collective ministry of diakonia? Treasurers - CEBA and UCC Covid Loan Repayments (due at the end of the year)

If you weren't able to attend the Webinar for Church Treasurers on Sept 27, 2023, it is recommend watching the recording on ChurchX. Here is the link:

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cD548k69oDs. CEBA and UCC covid loans repayments are due by December 31, 2023. If you don't pay in full by that date, you will not receive the benefit of the forgivable portion. If your Community of Faith is in danger of not being able to pay off the CEBA loan, General Council will consider loans for the purpose of paying the CEBA loan in time so you receive the benefit of the forgivable portion. Please send your request to hdootoff@united-church.ca by October 31. General Council is recommending paying your CEBA loan by end of November. Interest on loans start January 1, 2024.

Other items covered: *Information now available for 2024 budgeting; *UCC Protect insurance December renewals coming soon; *Changes coming for T4 reporting effective Jan 1, 2024 - best option to run all payroll through ADP; *Possible increased CRA reporting requirements related to trust and restricted funds; *CRA putting pressure on charities who are behind in T3010 and other reports. Fines and/or revocation penalties may apply.
