This updated policy is effective **January 1, 2024**.

NEW: Upcoming Stewardship Online Courses

A great place to kick-start your stewardship work is through one of our programs. Here is what is upcoming:

Setting Up Your Giving Program – Starts the week of **January 16** and requires a team (3-5 people) to participate. This course is designed for you to develop the resources you need to get your Congregational Giving Program off the ground! <u>To register or learn more click here</u>.
