NEW: Updates on Remit voting; accessing your M&S or Community of Faith ID

A letter was sent to all pastoral charges from General Secretary Rev. Michael Blair last week. The Regional Council has also sent a letter this week. Both have important reminders and resources on the Remit on creating an autonomous Indigenous organization within the United Church. The Regional letter also has an invitation to another learning time (see page 3). You are urged to set a date for a vote if you have not done so already. Next, the Regional Council will move into beginning to call pastoral charges who have not voted.

In order to vote, you will need your Mission and Service number or your Community of Faith ID. Your Mission and Service number can be found in your ChurchHub account or in your PAR info, if you use PAR. When you sign into your ChurchHub.ca, your Community of Faith ID number should be in the upper right-hand corner of your screen. If either of these aren't set up for you or just don't work, don't hesitate to call the office and we'll help.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – January 18 – 25, 2024

The 2024 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is on the theme "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbour as yourself" based on Luke 10:25-37. This year's theme was prepared by an ecumenical team in Burkina Faso.
