BUSINESS ARISING

Planning Committee – Regional Council Gathering 2023

The committee met this morning. They have a theme idea but it isn't really named as of yet. They will be focusing on themes of reconciliation. Chief Cadmus Delorme of Cowessess First Nation is going to be a theme speaker. We have also been invited to a Pow Wow on the Friday. Tracy Murton raised questions about accessibility for those who wish to attend the Pow Wow. There may be some difficulty moving across the gravel and grass. What about those who need assistance for hearing or seeing?

There has been some preparation by the Affirming task group to present information and possibly present a vote to become an affirming region (Julie isn't sure if this ready for a vote yet).

A Save the Date will be going out next week. People will be informed that they should book a hotel sooner rather than later.

There will also be the remit regarding the indigenous church. This will be a category 3 remit which means that all congregations needs to vote. There is planned to be lots of education around this remit so that the representatives are able to go back to their communities of faith and share the information before the vote.

Because of the Pow Wow, not sure if there will be time for Workshops at this gathering. Tracy Murton raised questions about pre-events. Groups like Ministry & Personnel and Lay Leadership Support are really wanting the opportunity to connect in person.

Property Commission

Property Commission Quarterly Report to Living Skies Regional Council Executive January 1 to March 31, 2022 The LSRC Property Commission held three meetings in the first quarter of 2022 (January 10, February 11 and March 11). All of our meetings are held using Zoom video conferencing. This report outlines the current status of our work and also summarizes the decisions that were made in the past three months.

Congregational Properties:

We are currently working with twenty-two communities of faith. As of March 31, 2021 we have four communities of faith that are planning to renovate, rent or purchase property, twelve in the process of selling property, and nine that are in the process of disbanding. In the past three months the following decisions were made:

Approval of Renovations:

 February 11, 2022 – Trinity Bissell Memorial United Church in Spiritwood (estimated cost \$38,164 – to be paid with proceeds from sale of manse)

Approval to Enter into Negotiations to Purchase:

• February 11, 2022 – Knox Metropolitan in Regina (to purchase adjacent parking lot)

Approval of Purchase of Property

 March 11, 2022 – Knox Metropolitan in Regina (adjacent parking lot for \$1,200,000 – to be paid with Trust Fund investments)

Approval of Listing of Church Buildings and/or Lots

- January 10, 2022 Knox United Church Manse in Gainsborough (by tender)
- February 11, 2022 Big River Manse (asking price \$168,000)
- February 11, 2022 Tompkins United Church (by tender)

Approval of Sale/Transfer of Church Buildings and/or Lots:

- February 9, 2022 Knox United Church Manse in North Portal (to Callie Elaine Fair and Dorothy Jean Fuchs for \$65,000) (email vote)
- February 11, 2022 St. James United Church in Lashburn (to Timothy Michael Krenbrink for \$110,000)

Disbanding of Congregation/Pastoral Charge:

- February 11, 2022 Clavet United Church
- March 11, 2022 Senlac United Church

The commission has also been working with the trustees of Third Avenue United Church, in our position as their governing body, to ensure that their final distribution of funds is completed as specified by the LSRC Executive. We are pleased to report that all cheques to charitable organizations have been distributed and a cheque for the remaining funds (\$31,834) has been received at the LSRC Office. We are now waiting for the requested financial records to be sent to Heather Dootoff. The

Trustees are also working to send their final report to the CRA and prepare church records for archival.

In January, the commission had a discussion with representatives from United Property Resource Corporation (UPRC) to give them some idea of church property issues in Saskatchewan and to discuss how they could be more involved. We also gave them suggestions of properties whose potential for income-generation could be investigated. We plan to meet with them again later this year.

Abandoned Properties

We are continuing our work to sell or transfer abandoned properties within the regional council. Some are being transferred to the village or rural municipality and others are being sold to neighbouring landowners. The following decisions were made in the first quarter:

Cemeteries

We are working with a list of forty-four cemeteries that are no longer connected to an active congregation. Sixteen have buildings on site. Some of the cemeteries will remain on our list and we will provide oversight to the people who are caring for the cemeteries. Other cemeteries are being transferred to organizations willing to take responsibility for their care. The following decisions were made in the last three months:

Policies & Processes

Some cheques from communities of faith to church organizations have taken a long time to cash. At Heather Dootoff's suggestion, we are changing our process so that

money to be distributed to church entities will be sent to the Livings Skies Regional Council and then distributed by the Financial Administrator.

We are in the process of reviewing the Property Handbook and expect to have an updated version available for approval in the next couple of months.

Thanks to the members of the property commission, Bev Kostichuk, Daryl Woods, George Thurlow, Gayle Wensley, Jonathan Zacharias and Shannon McCarthy for your continuing dedication to this important work. .

Archives

Shannon reported.

A huge part of the work may be able to be done online. An option is to contract that work to P2P or NS part time archivists and then hire another person for the in person part.

There is currently space at Lakeview.

Shannon will follow up with other groups who find themselves in the same situation due to this decision.

Our first priority is to keep the records in Saskatchewan. We don't want to hand over possession/ownership of our records. The second would be to place our archives in space that is available through the UCC in Ontario or the Maritimes.

This is based on the draft AGM Minutes of November 23, 2022, the 2022 board member approval form, contact list provided and receipt of other required documentation per The United Church of Canada Incorporated Ministries Policy.

Determining Criteria for Ordination

There are three criteria for ordination (The Manual, H.4.8):

- 1. Determination by the Office of Vocation of the candidate's fitness and readiness for ministry.
- 2. Confirmation of the completion of a program of study and recommendation by the school for ordination.
- 3. Confirmation of an approved call or offer of employment.

Tracy Murton presented a situation in which a current student candidate for ordination has met two of the criteria. However, she has not completed "Supervised Ministry Experience". She has been offered a full-time ministry position at Luther Heights (a seniors high rise connected to Luther Communities). She is hoping that this will fulfill the requirements of SME and would ultimately meet one of the criteria for ordination. Does the Executive feel that this would satisfy the criteria? This is being presented as a discussion, not a proposal at this time. Shannon or Tracy will find out if other regions have a policy for such exceptions. Do

we create a policy? The consensus seems to be that we accept and support this situation.

Tracy will communicate to Laura that we are in support.

Justice & **Communications**

Abortion is Healthcare

We agreed to share the links on the United Church Commons to some of the past Abortion stances of the UCC.

We need to find a way to address the issue of poor access to abortion in rural areas particularly. There is a similar issue with Medical Assistance In Dying (MAID), a large percentage of doctors will not even talk about MAID and they can't be forced to.

We agreed that we will set this aside until we have the letter that Abortion is Healthcare sent to the Sask Government.

Shannon will reach out to Abortion is Healthcare to try to get the letter.

Executive Minister

Shannon is continuing her university course titled "Managing Change". She has set aside most Fridays to work on her course work.

Julie is going on sabbatical. Trying to piece together how we cover that.

There will be a celebration in May for those communities who have closed/disbanded over the past year, as well as the remaining covenants.

People appreciate the opportunity to gather by Zoom but there is a yearning for inperson gatherings.

Tracy will be making the trip to Preeceville-Sturgis to help prepare for the welcome of an Admissions minister from Zimbabwe.

Last fall a national task group reviewed the cost of living groups. In Living Skies, half stayed the same and the other half went down a cost of living group which will be a significant impact on ministry personnel. Broadview has reached out to discuss. Very happy that Earl is back as she was covering for him while he was gone.

Re: We call for an immediate halt to the sale of Saskatchewan Crown land

Dear Premier Moe,

I am writing on behalf of Living Skies Regional Council, the United Church of Canada in Saskatchewan, to express our continued opposition to the selling of Crown lands entrusted to the province and held under Treaty agreements.

As chairperson of the Executive of our Regional Council, I was fortunate to learn of the Onion Lake Cree Nation's appearance at the Legislative Building on Monday, January 22 and so I attended along with many other Indigenous and non-Indigenous people.

I listened to their concerns about the Saskatchewan Government auctioning off Crown lands where First Nations hold ceremony, hunt, fish, trap and gather, and have done so for thousands of years.

In 2021, Living Skies Regional Council of the United Church and in 2017 the former Saskatchewan Conference of the United Church of Canada wrote a letter to the provincial government, joining many other groups in expressing strong concern about exactly the same issue, and reminding the government of our shared Treaty responsibilities and our commitment to healthy lands and waters. Yet these sales have continued unabated.

Now, the Treaty Land Sharing Network notes that, "Since 2007, the Saskatchewan government has sold nearly 2 million acres of Crown land that previously belonged to the people of this province. This land – totalling an area twice the size of Prince Albert National Park – includes formerly protected grassland, wetlands, and aspen parkland that are the territories of the Cree, Saulteaux, Nakota, Dakota, Lakota, and Métis Peoples."

On September 30, 2021, Premier Scott Moe posted on Facebook the following words: "Our government is committed to working with the Indigenous peoples of Saskatchewan in advancing cultural and economic reconciliation in our province."

The provincial government's First Nation and Métis Consultation Policy Framework (CPF) sets out government's commitment to fulfilling its legal duty to consult and accommodate First

Nation and Métis communities in advance of decisions or actions that have the potential to adversely impact the exercise of:

"Treaty and Aboriginal rights such as the right to hunt, fish and trap for food on unoccupied Crown land and other land to which a community has a right-of-access for these purposes; and

Traditional uses of land and resources such as the gathering of plants for food and medicinal purposes and carrying out ceremonial and spiritual observances and practices on unoccupied Crown land and other land to which a community has a right of access for these purposes."

How does the sale of Crown land, which is also Treaty land, support these stated commitments, especially when Indigenous nations and groups have protested such sales again and again? Our Executive suggests to you that it is impossible for Government-initiated sales of Crown land to respect either Treaty obligations and the government's own commitments.

We, the Living Skies Regional Council Executive on behalf of the United Church of Canada, call on the Saskatchewan government to halt the liquidation of public land immediately and to enter into agreed upon consultation processes with Indigenous peoples.

It is our commitment as the United Church to honour the Treaty relationship, protect natural landscapes, and ensure that all people have access to land for both leisure and livelihood. We long for the government of Saskatchewan to do the same.
