ATTENTION: Pastoral Charges with Manses

We have been notified by Erik Mathiesen, Chief Financial Officer of The United Church of Canada, about a requirement for all Pastoral Charges with manses to submit a CRA form related to "Underused Housing Tax" by April 30, 2024. It is the responsibility of the UC General Council and Regional Councils to flag the risk related to not complying. There is an apparent duty to file -with a penalty for noncompliance. For more information about the Underused Housing Tax, please read this memo. The General Council website offers some information here.
