#### **Updated: Invitation: Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage in your community**

In this season of Lent, and beyond, pilgrims in 125 countries are mapping the 41 km length of the Gaza Strip, by walking in prayerful solidarity with the people of Gaza, with all hostages and captives, and calling for a durable ceasefire. These pilgrimages are not demonstrations. They are times of deep lament, contemplation, and community solidarity. They can take place in communities of any size, in any configuration, with any partners, well into the spring and summer. #### **ATTENTION:** Pastoral Charges with Manses

We have been notified by Erik Mathiesen, Chief Financial Officer of The United Church of Canada, about a requirement for all Pastoral Charges with manses to submit a CRA form related to "Underused Housing Tax" by April 30, 2024. It is the responsibility of the UC General Council and Regional Councils to flag the risk related to not complying. There is an apparent duty to file with a penalty for noncompliance. ## 4. Reminders:

#### Action: Major concerns about Canada's military sales to Israel

United Church people are asked to keep <u>writing our members of Parliament using this action tool</u> or our own letters, as concern grows that Canada's military exports to Israel may risk complicity in genocide.

In their December 2023 report, "Fanning the Flames: The grave risk of Canada's arms exports to Israel," Project Ploughshares reveals that Canadian corporations, with permits granted by the Canadian government, regularly export military hardware and components to Israel. (Project Ploughshares is the ecumenical peace research body related to the Canadian Council of Churches, of which The United Church of Canada is a member.) In fact, when adjusted for inflation, Canadian sales in 2023 were almost as high as the peak year, 1987.

Only by ending its military exports to Israel can Canada meet its domestic and international obligations to eliminate violations of international humanitarian law in Gaza, including possible war crimes.
