NEW: Registration for the upcoming Regional Council Meeting is now open

The Living Skies Regional Meeting will be held from June 13 - 15, 2024 at the Saskatoon Travelodge (106 Circle Dr.), with the Service of Praise being held at Knox United Church (838 Spadina Cres. E.) beginning at 10am. The theme of this meeting will be 'Bold, Deep, Daring', a variation of the United Church's Call and Vision. Please ensure you have elected a Regional Representative for your Community of Faith who will be able to attend. Please see the Accommodations List on the Regional Gathering page for recommended accommodations and blocked room deadlines. Billeting will not be available at this meeting. This year, the registration fee is \$175 for the full in-person meeting and will include meals and break items provided at the meeting. The registration fee for joining on-line is \$50.

NEW: Reflections from a Growth Animator

One of the simplest ways to grow our community of faith is to be genuinely welcoming when new people come to our church. Although most people describe their community of faith as friendly and welcoming, newcomers often tell a different story. How does someone experience your community of faith when they don't already know people there? Invitation: plan for SK Arbor Week, May 19 - 25

NEW: Continued support for Search the Landfill; Red Dress Day

As we enter the hope of spring, the communities, families and loved ones of Rebecca Contois, Morgan Harris, Marcedes Myran, and Mashkode Bizhiki'ikwe (Buffalo Woman) continue the exhausting work of calling for a search of the landfills near Winnipeg. Jury selection for the trial of the accused murderer has begun, with the trial to begin this summer, and this is a very hard time for the loved ones and communities. As we get ready for May 5, Red Dress Day, let's do what we can as church people to end this terrible epidemic of violence. That includes bringing our resources, buildings, and our hearts and spirits to support this struggle.

Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization has passed!

All 16 Regional Councils, the National Indigenous Council, and just over 80% of pastoral charges in The United Church of Canada voted in the recent remit process. Huge thanks to all who participated in learning spaces, especially Indigenous knowledge keepers; to all who were on the phoning teams that helped push us into a large majority voting on the remit; and to all who voted, participated, and learned together. Updated April/ May Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage: in your own community and with national church leaders Throughout Lent, many communities of faith across Canada, and around the world, with their bodies prayerfully mapped Gaza onto their own communities through the worldwide Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage. This renewed invitation is for everyone! Walk or roll together in your own community, preferably before May 13. Pray and act for a ceasefire, and for more than a ceasefire- for a just peace for all in Palestine and Israel. KAIROS member church leaders, including Moderator Carmen Lansdowne, will gather in Ottawa on May 22-23 to bring these calls in person to the Government of Canada and Parliamentarians. They'll urge them to take immediate and sustained steps to advance and promote the calls made in the Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage. Please see the United Church site and the KAIROS site for more details.
