UPDATED FINAL CALL: Proposals to the Regional Council meeting Deadline: May 17

Proposals to the Regional Council or to General Council are the main avenue for asking the church to adopt policy positions or take specific and relevant action. They use a template for consistency, and to ensure that all the needed information for representatives or commissioners is included.

The Regional Council proposals template is now updated and ready for use. Registration: You don't need to be a delegate to the full meeting to attend - all are welcome, especially as a team from your community of faith or ministry. If you're already registered as a delegate, visitor, or guest for the full meeting, you don't need to register again. Here's the Saturday registration form. Deadline: May 27, because of catering deadlines.

Cost? Free. You will need to pay for lunch if you wish to have it at the hotel, but the day is free. **What's this about?** It's a space to collectively engage questions about how our communities and churches can thrive, instead of just survive.

The Living Skies Regional Meeting will be held from June 13 - 15, 2024 at the Saskatoon Travelodge (106 Circle Dr.), with the Service of Praise being held at Knox United Church 83 Spadina Cres. E.) beginning at 10am. The theme of this meeting will be 'Bold, Deep, Daring', a variation of the United Church's Call and Vision. Please ensure you have elected a Regional Representative for your Community of Faith who will be able to attend. This year, the registration fee is \$175 for the full in-person meeting and will include meals and break items provided at the meeting. The registration fee for joining on-line is \$50.

Reflections from a Growth Animator

One of the simplest ways to grow our community of faith is to be genuinely welcoming when new people come to our church. Folks who show up are looking for a community where they can experience belonging. How we welcome them - or fail to - will determine whether they come back again. Although most people describe their community of faith as friendly and welcoming, newcomers often tell a different story. How does someone experience your community of faith when they don't already know people there? Here is a story from a United Church Growth Animator about a community of faith who offered exceptional welcome to their family. Perhaps there are lessons for all of our communities of faith for how we can strengthen our welcome and grow our church.
