WORLD WIDE COMMUNION SUNDAY Olive Oil Communion and order of service

October 6, 2024 or other dates

Prepared by members of Living Skies Regional Council of The United Church of Canada and Mennonite Church SK as part of a focus on the olive harvest in the Occupied Palestinian Territories. Click here for more information.

PREPARATION

- Feel free to adapt and update this service for World Wide Communion Sunday as suits your situation. Included is the basic service format, with a suggestion for a Children's Time, and links to three diverse stories for reflection and an Olive Oil Communion liturgy.
- 2. The elements: pita bread and olive oil, preferably Palestinian where possible.
 - Palestinian olive oil is in short supply, with military and settler violence creating very difficult conditions for farmers and exporters. The planning team is ordering a crate of 12 750 ml bottles from Zatoun.com, which we hope to have by our first event on October 1. If you wish to purchase a bottle for the cost price of \$30 please contact Ursula Wiig, <u>ursula.wiig@sasktel.net</u>.
 - The Relief Collective, Islamic Relief Canada also has Palestinian olive oil, 250 ml for \$25 plus shipping. <u>Click here for their website</u>.
- 3. The distribution of the elements can be done by intinction, either by congregants dipping small pieces of pita into the cup of olive oil, or, with COVID precautions in mind, by having 2 sets of communion glasses, one to hold pieces of pita bread and the other a small bit of olive oil. Then the congregants do their own mini intinction by dipping the bread in the oil & consuming it. The traditional practice for 'holy oil' by Palestinian Orthodox Christians, Anglicans, and Catholics is for congregants to be anointed with olive oil as a reminder of their baptism with just as a touch on the forehead.
- 4. Hymns:
 - Now There Is War, O WALY WALY 8.8.8.8 ("Though I May Speak")

Now there is war and children die, but theirs is not the battle cry. This is their time to live and grow to think of things the young should know.

> This is their time to open doors to read new books, to do their chores, to make new friends, to share their bread. The world gives pain and death instead.

This is their time for soccer teams, for watching clouds, for dreaming dreams. They long for peace; they're told to, "Wait!" They long for love; they're taught to hate.

O God, your reign belongs to these who make up songs and skin their knees. May we seek peace and daily strive to build a world where they may thrive.

Advocacy: Prophetic justice calls us to take action on root causes. We call on Canada to stop fanning the flames of the atrocious violence in Gaza and the West Bank. With the Mennonite and United Churches, we call on all our churches and members to call for an immediate military embargo between Canada and Israel. There are many resources for raising our voices at <u>Arms Embargo Now</u>. Please prayerfully discern what action you can take.

A note about commemoration and lamentation:

Worldwide Communion Sunday falls on October 6 2024. The next day is the one-year anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel, and Israel's attack on Gaza. If you wish to include October 7 in your service, the Palestine-Israel Network of Mennonite Church Canada offers us all liturgy and prayers, scripture, stories, and the song "If the War Goes On" by John Bell, who gives voice to the questions we ask in times such as these. <u>Click here for a video of the song</u>. We commemorate with grief not only October 7 and the ensuing genocide, but the decades of violence that precede it, particularly the military occupation of the Palestinian Territories that stretches back multiple generations. We bear witness to the agony of all who live in this sacred land, and we commit to working for a just peace, in faith and in hope beyond hope.

As we approach the anniversary of the beginning of the war, we pray that we will not grow weary, that our compassion will not become exhausted, We pray that with your strength and inspired by the Palestinians resistance in the face of seemingly insurmountable obstacles, we will keep the faith and continue to fight for a just and lasting peace in the land where Jesus lived and loved, healed and taught. May your kin-dom come. Amen

OPTION 1: PRAYER FOR PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST

Bless all those who mourn, whose heartbreak and sorrow are too deep for words. In their despair may your unshakeable roots protect and hold them in love. And provide us all with the strength to yearn "more than those who watch for morning" for a time when peace prevails globally and in the Middle East.

Bless all who prayerfully seek a peace that leads toward abundant life for all people. Help those of us more removed from the direct conflict to care for and support those of us who are most affected in the Middle East and in our local communities. May we honestly wrestle with our complex emotions, biases, and limited information so that we can work with others toward peace-building that is guided by justice, compassion, and mercy. Together, may we anticipate a time when Israel and Palestine will be a symbol of justice, peace, and liberation for all.

all the days of our lives,

until all are able to live abundantly.
