Last call! River Run and bell ringing in support of Grassy Narrows First Nation, Wednesday Sept 18, 11:00AM CST/ MDT, 12:00PM CDT. This United Church endorsed action supports Grassy Narrows First Nation in northern Ontario, whose river is contaminated with mercury from off-reserve industrial operations. Their struggle for justice, health, and a return to clean water has gone on for decades. Grassy Narrows has called on the national community to help raise the profile of this struggle, and the United Church is asking us all to join in. This includes ringing our church bells or

creative alternatives (and being clear about why). That's when a community march is predicted to arrive at the Ontario provincial seat of government. (Freshwater is a provincial jurisdiction and successive Ontario governments have not taken action on this desperate situation and injustice.) Please see the link for full details, and join in!

We invite United Church people into this opportunity to understand the violence facing Palestinian farmers and villagers as they commence their annual olive harvest. In Gaza, part of the Occupied Palestinian Territories, harvest will not happen at all this year, amidst the unspeakable devastation and starvation. Our partners ask us to learn from them, to see signs of hope with them, and to offer them solidarity. Join us! Over time other imperial interests have read themselves into this "conquest narrative", as a cover story for their own colonizing projects here in the Americas, and in Australia, Africa, and Palestine.
