Olive harvest focus and resources for Palestine, October 2024

Living Skies and Mennonite Church SK invite United Church people into this opportunity to understand the violence facing Palestinian farmers and villagers as they commence their annual olive harvest. In Gaza, part of the Occupied Palestinian Territories, harvest will not happen at all this year, amidst the unspeakable devastation and starvation. Together, we will explore why, and what Canadians can do. We hope people who live in rural or remote areas closer to the rhythms of harvesting, fishing, and hunting will bring their lived experience to this work. Planned by SK United Church and Mennonite members, we warmly welcome you to film viewing, learning, worship, personal reflection, and advocacy. Key dates to help us prepare in advance include the Season of Creation, and the World Council of Churches' Week for Peace in Palestine and Israel. For October we offer resources for World Communion Sunday and World Food Day. Information will be shared throughout on this web page.
