#### Worldwide Communion Sunday, October 6: Palestinian Olive Oil liturgy and resource

We invite United Church people into this opportunity to understand the violence facing Palestinian farmers and villagers as they commence their annual olive harvest. In Gaza, part of the Occupied Palestinian Territories, harvest will not happen at all this year, amidst the unspeakable devastation and starvation. Our partners ask us to learn from them, to see signs of hope with them, and to offer them solidarity. Join us! The Ethics of Reading Biblical History: Cover Stories on Stolen Land, Sunday October 6,

7:00PM CST, in person in Saskatoon and on YouTube. Join us for a presentation by Biblical scholar and Professor Rev. Bill Richards looking at the context of the Prophets of the Jewish Bible, and the ethics behind the concept of "Promised Land" and chosen people. We'll look at history from the arrival of enslaved Hebrews in Palestine to the collapse of their various states at the hands of imperial powers. Over time other imperial interests have read themselves into this "conquest narrative", as a cover story for their own colonizing projects here in the Americas, and in Australia, Africa, and Palestine. These interpretations ignore significant voices within the Jewish Bible that challenge us to look at how "chosen people" should live with their neighbours. #### Commemorating death and grief in Palestine and Israel: worship resource available

Mennonite Church Canada's Palestine-Israel Network (PIN) encourages congregations to mark the **October 7** anniversary of the mass murder and kidnappings in Israel, and the start of the genocide in Gaza. The PIN has prepared an online package of resources designed for congregational prayer or small group use.
