Updated: The Stones Cry Out (2013) film viewing, Tuesday, October 29th at 7:00 pm CST, in person at Grace-Westminster United Church, Saskatoon, with an in person discussion after, plus a local option. This documentary lifts up the voices of Palestinian Christians who are often left out of coverage of the military occupation of Palestine. Although they are a small minority, Palestinian Christians have played a critical role in the territory's history and, as Palestine is the birthplace of Christianity, this community has a global significance for Christians.

The film covers Palestinian Christians' experiences from 1948 to the modern era, including the effects of the Israeli military occupation on Bethlehem. \*\*For those who cannot attend in person and want to view this film you can see online for free here, and we encourage you to host a local group viewing followed by discussion.
