NEW: Update on United Church policy on Palestine and Israel

On October 19, the online meeting of General Council 44 adopted new policies related to Palestine and Israel. In summary, the United Church is: * adopting the strategies of Boycott, Divestment and Sanction (BDS) movement and; * responding positively to the request of NEW04 - Join the Apartheid Free Communities Movement, and; * joining the consensus of the international human rights community in recognizing and rejecting Israel's apartheid system of laws and legal procedures towards the Palestinian people.

NEW: Saskatchewan connection to the Gaza crisis asks for our help

Gaza is far away, and its suffering is incomprehensible, but Saskatchewan people do have connections. One of those is orthopedic surgeon Dr. Deirdre, originally from SK, who is currently serving with a medical aid organization in southern Gaza despite the immense personal risk. She has shared some heart-wrenching accounts about conditions in the hospital since she arrived in Gaza again in mid-October. Dr. Deirdre has asked us to plead for the world to take note of the slaughter in North Gaza, and the targeting of hospitals, where many of her Palestinians colleagues are labouring in desperate circumstances while Israel withholds aid and deliberately kills health workers. This documentary lifts up the voices of Palestinian Christians who are often left out of coverage of the military occupation of Palestine. Although they are a small minority, Palestinian Christians have played a critical role in the territory's history and, as Palestine is the birthplace of Christianity, this community has a global significance for Christians.

The film covers Palestinian Christians' experiences from 1948 to the modern era, including the effects of the Israeli military occupation on Bethlehem. There will be a Zoom Discussion offered on **November 6, 2024 from 1:30 – 2:30pm (Sk time).** After <u>watching the film</u> for free, join in an online discussion led by members of the Olive Harvest Planning Team.
