NEW: The Stones Cry Out film discussion online, Wednesday, November 6, 1:30pm CST.

This is our final Olive Harvest event. This 30-minute introductory film lifts up the voices of Palestinian Christians who are often left out of coverage of the military occupation of Palestine. It covers Palestinian Christians' experiences from 1948 to the modern era, including the effects of the Israeli military occupation on Bethlehem. Healing Haunted Histories decolonization course, Mennonite Church SK and Canadian

Mennonite University, in person in Saskatoon, November 11-15. Through bible studies, social analysis, communal narratives and historic literacy, this interactive course will explore how Canadian landscapes are "haunted" by historic and continuing violence against Indigenous peoples. We will examine how trauma and resilience, as well as devised and dismembered stories, inhabit our settler communal places, memories and myths. This is an intensive course, with classes running from 9am-12pm, and then 1pm-4pm (roughly) each day. <u>Click here for full details</u>.
