Since there is no official daytime warming center in La Ronge, the kindness of Abby and Marker 47 is truly appreciated.

I have been fortunate to be another "agent of Santa Claus", a term I heard on your show today. I have been delivering mitts and toques to the unhoused, the shelter and to the schools that need them in the La Ronge area. They have been knitted by a very kind 90-year-old from the Mount Royal Emmanuel congregation in Saskatoon. She must have been knitting all year around to create the bags of warm things she sent! In past years, there has been a team of knitters from the congregation doing the same; the non-knitters contribute by paying for the wool. I had the pleasure of seeing the smiles and appreciation on faces as I delivered the gifts and told her story. I wish she could have been there to witness those herself.

A CHRISTMAS PRAYER:


May the reality that Christ came to earth for you, stir in you a fresh sense of wonder and awe.
