About Us



The United Church of Canada was created in 1925, through the union of multiple Protestant denominations and local union churches. Later that year, Saskatchewan Conference established its archives, at St. Andrew's College (Saskatoon), to serve as the official repository for United Church records in Saskatchewan, including those from local United Church congregations. In the 1980s, the Conference moved its collection to the Provincial Archives. In 2019, Saskatchewan Conference became Living Skies Regional Council.

Our collection contains a range of records from Presbyterian, Methodist, Congregationalist and local union churches prior to 1925, as well as local, presbyterial, Conference and Regional records created by the United Church in Saskatchewan, from 1925 onwards.

Donating or Transferring Records

In addition to records created by local church congregations and groups, the Region archives also collects records created by and relating to individuals and organizations associated with the United Church.

Church Registers

Congregations or individuals may request a search for specific information from archived church baptism, marriage or burial registers, at any time. Please **e-mail** or **mail** requests to:

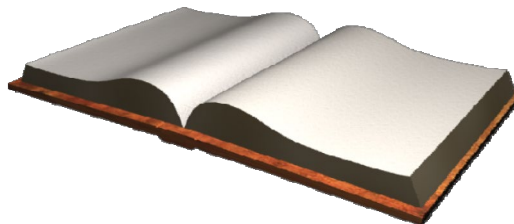

Registers are organized by church, event, and date, so **we cannot conduct speculative searches based on names alone**. Please be sure to include in your request: relevant name(s); location; date; your contact information; and the purpose of your research, so we can help identify what record would be most useful.
