Call to support those affected by the wildfires in the north: Message from the Region

<u>Please see the full statement here</u>. <u>A printable pdf is here</u>. "The fires are ravaging the northern part of our province, and those of our western and eastern neighbours. Lives are at stake, sacred ancestral lands, homes and farms are threatened; evacuation orders are not just in place but are being implemented.

...It is our calling not only to offer prayers, but also to stand at the ready, with arms wide open, to help all those affected. We can all help, depending on our abilities and location. We can all pray, and then we must roll up our sleeves.

If your location and facility allow, consider getting ready to open your doors to those who have no roof over their heads, getting ready to feed the hungry, getting ready to comfort the grieving and the scared. Co-ordinate those efforts with the local government or appropriate community unit. If emergency housing is already being organised or provided in, or near, your community then reach out and simply ask: "How can we help?" — Rev Piotr Strzelecki, chair of the Regional Council.

Keewatin Circle, the Indigenous United Church in Manitoba, invites you to pray with them for all communities in Canada regarding the forest fire emergencies. Praying will take place for 1 hour each evening beginning at 7:00pm CDT (MB/ NWO), 6:00pm Mountain and CST We are praying for the following:

- Rain
- Safety of all communities
- Safety of evacuees
- Safety for all those responding to the needs of evacuees.
- Safety for those who are in communities fighting fires.
- As well as the animals both domestically and wild

We are asking that all communities pray with us, as prayer is stronger when we come together in time of need.

Check to see how your municipality, schools, and libraries are marking this time. Take in the Indigenous programming on APTN (Aboriginal Peoples' Television Network) and the CBC.

This year, the United Church celebrates <u>National Indigenous Day of Prayer</u> on **Sunday, June 15**. New worship materials are available on the <u>United Church website</u>. This year's resources feature an order of service from the perspectives of both Bible and Bundle by the Rev. Agnes Spence of Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation, and another marking the 10th anniversary of the release of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Calls to Action from the Rev. Emma Seamone of Carberry, MB.

United Church's 100th Anniversary:

Updated: Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

As we enter the month of The United Church of Canada's 100th Anniversary, here is another one of Gayle Simonson's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our fourteenth vignette, she writes:

NEW: The church has a long and varied history, providing both education and medical care across the country as communities developed. While the early workers are gone, many kept records and some of those records have survived to tell us of people and of the work they did under difficult conditions. In the early 1950s, the United Church established a central archive in Toronto at Victoria University though it has recently moved. Others were established across the country and today an archives network includes eight regional archives to protect our stories. As stated in 1924 by Canada's Dominion Archivist Arthur G. Doughty, "Of all national assets, archives are the most precious. They are the gift of one generation to another."
