NEW: Call to support those affected by the wildfires in the north: Message from the Region Please see the full statement here. A printable pdf is here.

"The fires are ravaging the northern part of our province, and those of our western and eastern neighbours. Lives are at stake, sacred ancestral lands, homes and farms are threatened; evacuation orders are not just in place but are being implemented.

...It is our calling not only to offer prayers, but also to stand at the ready, with arms wide open, to help all those affected. We can all help, depending on our abilities and location. We can all pray, and then we must roll up our sleeves.

If your location and facility allow, consider getting ready to open your doors to those who have no roof over their heads, getting ready to feed the hungry, getting ready to comfort the grieving and the scared. Co-ordinate those efforts with the local government or appropriate community unit. If emergency housing is already being organised or provided in, or near, your community then reach out and simply ask: "How can we help?"

Updated: Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

As we enter the month of The United Church of Canada's 100th Anniversary, here is another one of Gayle Simonson's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our twelfth vignette, she writes:

NEW: The first ministers in the United Church in 1925 included Robert and Egerton, the sons of Ojibway missionary Henry Bird Steinhauer, who had established the Methodist mission at Whitefish Lake, Alberta in the 1850s. Robert served in a number of Indigenous congregations in Alberta and, like his father, spoke out about the treatment of native people. In 1936, he became the first indigenous person to receive a Doctor of Divinity degree from their alma mater Victoria College. Egerton served first in the west and from 1918 to retirement in 1926 worked with the Ojibwa on Lake Huron. Together they published a hymn book in Cree in 1920.

UPDATED: Structural Change Evaluation Survey - YOUR INPUT IS IMPORTANT!

The time has come to evaluate the impact of the restructuring of the United Church from four courts to three councils. Did it accomplish what was intended? As part of the evaluation, a survey has been developed to invite wide participation from across the church. It has been sent via email, using email addresses in ChurchHub, to:

- 1. All pastoral charges—to be completed at a meeting of the Board/Council;
- 2. All ministry personnel;
- 3. All regional council staff, Office of Vocation staff, and General Council staff impacted by the change.

The Structural Change Evaluation Steering Group has engaged Credence and Co., a consulting firm, to collect and analyze the data to protect anonymity and prevent bias in reporting.

If you did not receive the survey, please check your junk email. Also please ensure that the correct email address is attached to your ChurchHub profile to ensure you receive reminder emails which will contain the necessary link.

The survey will be open until **June 15, 2025**. Please make time to respond as a comprehensive and useful evaluation depends on input from across the church.

NEW: Indigenous Day of Prayer June 15, and Indigenous Peoples' Day June 21

June is Indigenous History Month and **June 21** is National Indigenous Peoples' Day. This is a time to celebrate the outstanding achievements, history, cultures, and diversity of Indigenous peoples. This is also the time of summer solstice.

Check to see what First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities and organizations in your area are doing to celebrate, and join in. Check to see how your municipality, schools, and libraries are marking this time. Take in the Indigenous programming on APTN (Aboriginal Peoples' Television Network) and the CBC.

This year, the United Church celebrates <u>National Indigenous Day of Prayer</u> on **Sunday, June 15**. New worship materials are available on the <u>United Church website</u>. This year's resources feature an order of service from the perspectives of both Bible and Bundle by the Rev. Agnes Spence of Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation, and another marking the 10th anniversary of the release of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Calls to Action from the Rev. Emma Seamone of Carberry, MB.

NEW: Choking Gaza: why aid isn't getting through, and what we can do.

Thursday June 19, 7:00PM CST (SK) Gaza's people are dying of imposed hunger and thirst. Its medical system is targeted for destruction, and people of all ages suffer continuous bombing. We'll learn about why aid isn't getting through, the terrible impact, and what Canadians can do through our donations and advocacy- because we can do something!

We are grateful to hear from Dr. Deidre Nunan, a Saskatchewan-trained orthopaedic surgeon who primarily works in the international medical humanitarian field.
