

Due to the fire situation around Candle Lake the three-day Women's Camp that was to take place June 20-22 has been **cancelled.**

We were welcomed by tea, coffee and wonderful muffins. Each of us was assigned to one of 6 table groups as soon as we arrived. It was a wonderful way to meet new women from other places. Including organizers there were 48 women in attendance, most from the southwest corner of Saskatchewan and 4 of us from Saskatoon. I was able to reconnect with Norma Hain from Swift Current who had attended the NUCW 60th Anniversary Conference in Cape Breton. We were able to have 3 of the Sask UCCW executive attend. Rev. Deb Ferber – Co-Chair, Eleanor Bowie -1st Vice-Chair, Phyllis Robinson – Treasurer.



Catherine led us in some chair exercises. After travelling for 3 ½ hours from Saskatoon I know our group from Saskatoon appreciated the gentle stretching and movement.

Stories from Churches and UCW groups, memories and histories were shared in our table groups. A special part of sharing at my table was meeting Audrey McPherson who had been on the UCW Convening Committee with my mother, Elaine La Marche.

Lunch was served in the Legion Hall. It was a nice stroll past some lovely gardens and some newly planted trees in the Abbey United Church yard. Some of the group from Swift Current arrived in their Kinsmen Telemiracle Access Transit Bus. Anyone with mobility issues were easily driven to lunch. I believe the driver was a UCW member. Lunch was a beautiful Italian meal catered by a local couple. A variety of breads with different spreads, mini-meat balls, salad and pasta with homemade panna cotta for dessert.

Craft time we made felt flower crowns. Sharon from Abbey made the flowers this winter. It was an easy fun craft to make. Every woman had their own crown like the queens we are. Personal note, I did use lavender and purple flowers in my crown.



We returned to the sanctuary for the Worship Service, Memorials, Communion and the business meeting. For communion we were in our table groups again. It felt like a fitting way to bring closure with the group we just met that morning.

The Southwest UCW's have a long history of working with Camp Shagabec. They shared some highlights of the camp's history and what is happening now. Each summer there are around 80 youth attending the camp. The online registration is usually sold out in 15 minutes. The UCW gathering had a cookie drive and had hundreds of cookies donated for the camp. After expenses covering the day, all proceeds are donated to the camp.

When I had the opportunity to speak with the ladies, I asked them to share with women from across the province how much we would like to know of any other gatherings, camps and women's activities in the local United Churches. With my love of travel, I would like to attend events. I reminded the ladies of our annual AGM for Sask UCCW in Saskatoon and spoke about the 65th Anniversary UCW Conference in Ottawa in 2027.
