On **September 30**, wear an **orange shirt** to say that Every Child Matters. And on **September 28**, mark <u>Orange Shirt Sunday</u> in your community of faith. This year in particular we ask you to honour the children with <u>gift or special offering to the Healing Fund</u>, which supports initiatives for survivors of the residential school system and its ongoing intergenerational impacts.

On **September 30**, we also invite you to join in the <u>Remembering the Children: National Day for Truth and Reconciliation event</u> on Parliament Hill. This 90-minute program is a united effort of the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, the Algonquin Nation, APTN, and CBC/Radio-Canada. **It begins at 3:00 p.m. ET** and all are welcome. Not near Ottawa? It will also be broadcast live on APTN and on YouTube.

On Tuesday, September 30, 2025, former Moderator The Very Rev. Dr. Carmen Landsdowne will be in Treaty 4 for the launch of her new book *Wearing a Broken Indigene Heart on the Sleeve of Christian Mission* in which seeks to engage the question, "If Indigenous hearts are broken by Christianity, what is it in Christian theology that is life giving at all?" Time and location are still to be determined. Carmen will share from her book and engage us all in conversation. We are working to have copies of the book available for sale at the event – books can also be ordered online here. She notes that this is an academic focused book (and she reads macro-economics for fun) but has written a Study Guide designed for non-academic uses which is available here for free download.

United Church's 100th Anniversary:

Updated: Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

As we enter the month of The United Church of Canada's 100th Anniversary, here is another one of Gayle Simonson's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our nineteenth vignette, she writes:

NEW: In 1992 the United Church elected Reverend Stan McKay from the Fisher River Cree Nation in Manitoba as its first aboriginal moderator. After his schooling at the Fisher River, then Birtle Indian Residential Schools, he studied at the University of Winnipeg and was ordained following graduation from the Faculty of Theology. Throughout his career, he has sought opportunities for reconciliation. As a co-director of the Dr. Jessie Saulteaux Centre (now the Sandy-Saulteaux Centre) in Manitoba, he created opportunities for non-indigenous people to learn about indigenous cultures. There, both Indigenous and Christian beliefs are respected and shared. In 1992, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate degree from the University of Winnipeg and in1997, received a National Aboriginal Achievement Award.
