NEW: 100 Tables local projects continues!

The United Church of Canada's 100 Tables project really took off this summer. As of August 22, there are 109 communities of faith registered as hosts of a table in their town or city. Part of our 100th anniversary celebrations, this an initiative that turns ordinary picnic tables into extraordinary places of welcome, and part of our campaign to create A Place at the Table for all to join. Rooted in justice, compassion, and radical belonging, 100 Tables invites communities to create tables that reflect local priorities, whether those are food security, care for creation, 2S and LGBTQIA+ inclusion, or reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples. Consider what your community can offer!

Looking to live out your land acknowledgement? A congregation in Hamilton, Ontario was inspired to learn how Indigenous ministry students at Sandy-Saulteaux Spiritual Centre in Manitoba are showing the broader church a path to reconciliation. Updated: Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

Here is one of Gayle's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our twentieth vignette, she writes:

NEW: For nearly 125 years, the United Church and its predecessor denominations have offered health care in remote areas of Canada's west coast. Hospitals in Bella Bella and Bella Coola B.C.

have operated with support from the Mission and Service fund. Health care professionals have often been recruited through the United Church. Services have included emergency care and obstetrical services as well as physiotherapy, pharmacy and public and mental health education. The most serious cases could be transferred by air to Vancouver or Victoria, accompanied by a medical professional. These hospitals most recently have worked in conjunction with the Vancouver Coastal Health Authority (VCHA) and United Church involvement in these hospitals is currently coming to an end.
