On Tuesday, September 30, 2025, former Moderator The Very Rev. Dr. Carmen Landsdowne will be in Treaty 4, at Broadway United Church (105 Broadway Ave, Regina) for the launch of her new book Wearing a Broken Indigene Heart on the Sleeve of Christian Mission in which seeks to engage the question, "If Indigenous hearts are broken by Christianity, what is it in Christian theology that is life giving at all?" She notes that this is an academic focused book (and she reads macro-economics for fun) but has written a Study Guide designed for non-academic uses which is available here for free download.

United Church's 100th Anniversary:

Updated: Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

As we enter the month of The United Church of Canada's 100th Anniversary, here is another one of Gayle Simonson's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our twenty-first vignette, she writes:

NEW: All three founding denominations stressed the value of education. At union, Methodist Rev. Dr. Samuel Rose noted the Methodist respect for learning and the struggle for public schools open to all, a struggle that Methodist Rev. Egerton Ryerson had spearheaded in Upper Canada. Presbyterian Dr. John T. McNeill also noted the importance of education. "Our colleges have been

nurseries both of religion and learning." He felt they brought "a knack for conserving the values of the past while moving on in obedience to a new and true vision." Congregationalist Dr. W.H. Warriner stressed spirituality, Christian freedom and Catholicity, an acceptance of all forms of worship as new revelations continue to expand our faith. The new United Church inherited colleges from coast to coast.
