#### NEW: Christmas comes early: An Advent Gift for Living Skies Communities of Faith

We never tire of the story. Each Advent, we set out the beloved figures of the creche and are invited again into the mystery of incarnation. In this small group study and worship series, we look more closely at the figures and what they reveal about the human journey of faith, the bigger picture of Love, and the Divine Longing at the heart of Christmas.

Alongside four study sessions, you'll also receive complete Advent worship services—rich with liturgy, Advent candle-lighting, all-ages activities, Scripture, reflections, prayers, and music suggestions. Together, they invite us to approach the creche with fresh wonder, to notice who is present (and who is missing), and to be shaped by Love that is already here and still arriving. #### **Attention treasurers**

The 2026 Minimum Salaries and Reimbursements for Ministry Personnel document is now available at this link. This includes the updated visiting minister and travel rates, effective January 1, 2026. Please ensure the ADP contact for your community of faith communicates this information accurately for ministry personnel, and that adjustments are made for reimbursing (and budgeting) for pulpit supply.

#### **Self-Assessment season**

The Manual requires communities of faith to complete a self-assessment to help ensure adherence to the polity and practices of the denomination. This replaces the old pastoral oversight process and happens every 3 years. The Committee on Community of Faith Support has updated the document with links for information, and is preparing to host online Zoom conversations for guidance and support. The answers provided on the form do not require approval, but will be reviewed by the Committee to determine how best to provide support for communities of faith around our Regional Council. #### **Updated:** Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year continue

Here is one of Gayle's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our *twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh vignette*, she writes:

**NEW:** In 1953, General Council established a Commission to Study Women's Work in the Church. The Commission was, of course, chaired by a man! Several years later, recommendations were to establish a united women's organization and to further full partnership of women and men in the church. The 1960 General Council agreed that women could "share in a much more meaningful way in all the work of the Church" by allowing them finally to participate in boards at all levels. Final approval was given to the United Church Women (UCW), at the General Council meeting held in Edmonton in 1960. The UCW officially came into being January 1, 1962. The women have certainly taken up the challenge of full participation in leadership.

**NEW:** Rev. Thomas Richard Davies was ordained in Alberta in 1930 and served in Ponoka and Stettler before being called to Highlands United Church in Edmonton in 1940. As a military chaplain in Europe 1942-1945 he was deeply moved by the events of war and the devastation he experienced. He began collecting pieces of stained glass from the shattered churches he saw through France, Germany and Holland, and carefully labeled each with its original location. On his return to Highlands, 24 pieces were incorporated into a memorial window, the glass surrounding a list of members lost during the war. Highlands website records the image and story for all to share in this tribute to the terrible losses of war.
