United Church's 100th Anniversary:

Updated: Short reminders of our history from the Centennial year continues

As we enter the new year, here is another of Gayle Simonson's very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle, who offers us these 100-word history vignettes for use in your own community! **Please remember to credit!** For our *fortieth* vignettes, she writes:

NEW: In 1989, Little Britain United Church, a stone building near Lockport, received provincial historic site designation as the oldest United Church building in Manitoba. Near Lower Fort Garry, it owed its early roots to Presbyterian Scottish workers for the Hudson's Bay company. In 1863 the HBC provided a land grant. The first building had a thatched roof! Like many early churches, it was also used as a school. Though most travel was by boat along the Red River, a trail for Red River carts connected it to the fort. The stone building was completed in 1874. A bell tower constructed in 1920 commemorates those killed in WW I. In 2004, a 4800 square foot hall was constructed. Recent photos are available on the website of the Manitoba Historical Society.

Into the Future:

NEW: 2026 Annual Declaration – Now Open

The portal for completing the 2026 Annual Declaration is now open on ChurchHub.

All ministry personnel (active, voluntary associates, and retired), including candidates, are required to complete the annual declaration before **April 30** in order to remain in compliance with United Church standards for ministry personnel and to maintain eligibility for calls, appointments, and licenses for sacraments and marriages.

Access the declaration by logging on to ChurchHub: <https://churchhub.ca/>.

Once logged on, you will need to:

- Declare whether you have had any criminal charges in the past year
- Attest that you have reviewed the *Creating Safe and Respectful Environments Policy and Procedures*
- Attest that you have reviewed the *Ethical Standards and Standards of Practice for Ministry Personnel*

NEW: Arbor Week - May 25-31, 2026 / Arbor Day - May 29, 2026

We live in a world increasingly detached from and alienated from creation. Personalizing, tapping memories, stories and dreams can move us into action and engagement. From Genesis to the Revelation to John, the Bible celebrates the Tree of Life, and trees of life, as an essential part of God's healing intentions for all creation and all of humankind. *"On either side of the river was the tree of life producing food every month of the year, and with leaves for the healing of the nations.* (Rev. 22:1-2) *What could we do in our congregations to celebrate trees and to participate in Arbor Week/Arbor Day 2026?* It might be something we could do as a congregation (maybe reaching into our community/maybe intergenerationally) or something a group within our congregation might do, or households, or even individuals. **Suggestion #2:** For a starter, everyone is invited to write a letter to a tree. Find ways to share these letters in worship, at refreshments time, or on-line. Example: *Dear Old Maple: You were old when I met you in Grandma Z's backyard. You had three great trunks and branches to climb on. One had an old swing. I used to tell you stories and you always listened to my complaints. Even thinking about you now helps me smile and even feel healthier.* (see December 3/25 Rambler for Suggestion #1)
